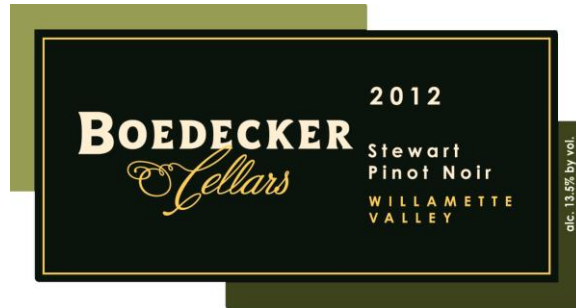

VINEYARDS

201' Stewart Pinot Noir is a cuvée from our vineyards planted primarily on volcanic soils and at higher elevations to provide high acidity-to the classic clones of Pommard and Wadenswil.

Shea Vineyards is a 200 acre vineyard first planted in the late 1980s and renown for some of the highest quality Pinot Noir in the Willamette Valley. Carlton Hill Vineyard was planted in 1999 on an East-facing slope at the foot of the Coast Range. Hirschy Vineyard was planted in 2007 just up the hill from the town of Yamhill, and Stoller Vineyards is located in volcanic soils in Oregon's Dundee Hills AVA.

WINEMAKING

In order to single out the unique qualities of the vines, we ferment each vineyard, block, and clone separately in small 1.5 ton open top fermenters. We embrace spontaneous ferments, utilizing the unique yeasts from each vineyard's own indigenous population to enhance the diversity in each site's terroir. Secondary malolactic fermentation is also spontaneous, and elevage is sur lie, with lees stirring every 3 weeks. While mostly whole berry, the 35% whole cluster adds complex notes of olive wood and spice to deep intense berry flavors of the wine.
