Weingut Huber 2013 Pinot Noir Dry

Vintage 2013 at Huber:

"After a long cold winter followed a cool and rainy spring. This led to a late bud burst and late flowering of the grapes. By the cool temperatures during vine blossoming we got small grapes with thick skins. During summertime we had mixed weather conditions.

Just before the harvest start the sky opened and it rained. The harvest time was connected with a lot of work. We had to make an extreme selection in the vineyards which resulted in a reduction in yield by 25%. But finally after the first month of vinification the vintage shows a ripe and also fresh fruit with a well-integrated acidity. Our Pinot Noirs have a deep ruby red colour with a nose full of fruits.

We harvested wonderfully ripe and healthy grapes because we had put a lot of work into optimally selecting the grapes in two or three harvesting passes." (Owner/Winemaker Bernd Huber)

Characteristic Refreshing and young taste. Made out of vines which are between 6 and 12 years old. Already for this basic wine we practice the "green harvest" to reduce the crop to approximately 65 hl/ha. Deep ruby red colour with a nose full of fruits.

Pairing A good accompaniment to roasted meat, Hungarian goulash or roasted game.

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
