Pierre qui roule, is a wine that hails from a vineyard in the village of Pégairolles de l'Escalette in Languedoc. Julien Zernott of Domaine du Pas de l'Escalette, select Grenache and Syrah from this high altitude vineyard to create an accessible and friendly wine.

The goal is to produce a wine that retains the character of its terroir, that is refreshing and easy to drink.

Pierre qui roule comes from the word « Pégairolles », which in the local Occitan language means « rolling stone ». In our region, stones play a role in our every day lives, from the Causse limestone boulders that cover the vines , to the dry stone walls of buildings which surround our vineyards, or to the clapas (pile of stones) that protect us This stone acts as mulch to our soils and reflects the minerality of our wines.

Pierre qui roule, a wine made exclusively from the Valley of Pégairolles de l'Escalette, is a blend of 70% Grenache and 30% Syrah. Delicious and refreshing, it displays the true character of its vineyard, with its high altitude and limestone rock fragmented soils of the Causse du Larzac.
